COVID-19 safety guidance when visiting Knightswood Community Centre

The following information will hopefully assist in making your visit enjoyable

Be Fully Vaccinated

We ask that everyone visiting the Centre is fully vaccinated where applicable.

You will not be asked for a 'vaccine passport' or a test certificate, but please act responsibly.

Coronavirus tests

Please have rapid lateral flow or PCR coronavirus test before visiting and do not attend if the test proves negative.

You can arrange a test via [NHS Inform](#) or, if you can't get online, by calling 0800 028 2816.

Feeling Unwell

If you are feeling unwell, please do not visit.

Check In

Check in using the Check In Scotland QR code displayed on posters at the main entrance door.

Alternatively, you can check in by providing you contact details to a member of staff.

Face Coverings

Face Coverings must be worn by everyone over the age of 12 when entering or leaving the Centre, visiting the toilets, and when seated except when an exemption applies, or where there is a 'reasonable excuse' not to wear a face covering (for example, when eating or drinking).

Sanitising and Cleaning

Please use the hand sanitising station located in the foyer.

Physical Distancing

Physical distancing has been one of the most effective methods to protect ourselves and others from getting COVID-19 therefore even though physical distancing regulations have been lifted, everyone should continue to keep a reasonable distance, especially in crowded places.

Ventilation

To provide adequate ventilation and improve fresh air circulation, windows will be open.
